## Revenue Changes to 2021-2022

-Legislature has not approved the State Budget and Municipal Aid is not guaranteed.

-Increase in Pilot Funding - worked with Rep. Brian Lanoue to have Voluntown added as a Tier One Town which could increase pilot funding by 84,532

-Decrease in ECS Fund - Voluntown is set to have a decrease of 87,995 for FY22 and 175,991 FY23

Town Clerks Office - All records electronically accessible, Finished Codification of Ordinances



Tax Collector - Finished Tax Collector Certification, Reduced Costs for Tax Bills, Implemented Tax Deferrals for residents in need.



Tax Assessor - Completed a Town Wide Revaluation. Upgrading to a New GIS System to better improve services to residents.



Building Department - New Building and Land Use Secretary. All permits now online, working on ePermitting system

## Budget Changes to 2021-2022

#### **BOARD OF SELECTMEN**

- a. Cost of Living 2.5%. There was no increase last year
- b. Data Processing Currently have physical servers in the Town Hall. Moving to Cloud Based Servers. Easier for remote working, less risk for cybersecurity
- c. Contractual Obligations Payroll costs, Pension Costs, Medicare.
- d. Auditor Increase Due Covid Increase in reporting requirements and Federal Single Audit necessary due to CRF and ARPA.

## Budget Changes to 2021-2022

#### **PUBLIC WORKS**

- Salary Union Contract Obligations
- Transfer Station Costs Increases for Bulky Waste, MSW
- Fuel Increase Diesel went from \$1.88 a gallon to \$2.40 a gallon plus propane added for the Garage
- Highway Material/Signs/Small Tools/Uniforms
- Snow Removal Still under funded. Salt plant closed will have an increase in salt costs.
- Town Garage Maintenance Oil/Water Separator tank needs pumping at least 3 times a year, plus maintenance/cleaning of garage
